The Fight for D.C. Home Rule: Past, Present, and Future

FIFTY YEARS AGO, Washingtonians won a milestone victory—the right to elect their own mayor and city council. The 1973 Home Rule Act was a hard-fought achievement, championed by civil rights leaders, including Martin Luther King, Jr. But it came with compromises. Congress retained control over D.C.'s laws and budget, leaving residents with limited self-governance and no voting representation in the House or Senate. In Q1 2024, WAMU produced a special series—culminating in a special episode of *The Politics Hour with Kojo Nnamdi*—to explore the past and future of home rule, tracing its impact on the District today and examining what's next in the fight for full political rights. Through in-depth reporting and conversations with activists, policymakers, and residents, we ask: Is statehood the only real path forward?

CANADIAN WILDFIRES

Summer 2023: Smoke from Canada's wildfires made D.C.'s air hazardous, with multiple Code Red days. WAMU examined the smoke's long-term health risks and asked: Is this the region's new normal?

FBI HEADQUARTERS

Fall 2023: The business of governing drives the D.C. region, and the decision to move the FBI headquarters to Maryland made waves. WAMU explored what this means for the region's economy, politics, and future.

CAPITALS/WIZARDS MOVE

Winter 2023: The proposed move of the Washington Wizards and Capitals to Virginia sent shockwaves through the region. WAMU reporters followed the story from its initial proposal to the final decision to keep the teams downtown, examining the political and economic stakes for the entire region.

Your Election 2024 Guide

Going Beyond the Headlines to Bring You Deeper Context

IN A YEAR OF UNPRECEDENTED POLITICAL TWISTS, WAMU delivered essential coverage and in-depth analysis across platforms. From President Biden's withdrawal to an assassination attempt, we aired NPR's special coverage, broke down key moments on *The Politics Hour with Kojo Nnamdi*, explored national stakes on *1A* with Jenn White, and offered historical perspective weekly on Diane Rehm's *On My Mind* podcast. Our newsroom provided deep local reporting, ensuring the D.C. region wasn't just watching history—they understood its impact. That included comprehensive election guides for Maryland, the District, and Northern Virginia, that gave voters the information they needed. WAMU also hosted an election night special and a live call-in show to help our audience make sense of the stakes. With the best of NPR, BBC, and our own journalists, WAMU was there—when history happened and when it mattered most.

OTHER IMPACT COVERAGE

YOUR GO-TO GUIDES

Fall 2024: WAMU's voter guides provided easy-to-navigate information for D.C., Maryland, and Northern Virginia including key races, ballot measures, and voting logistics, ensuring our audience was well-prepared to cast informed ballots.

LISTENING TO VOTERS

Fall 2024: As violence in the Middle East escalated, many Muslim voters in Northern Virginia felt abandoned by both parties. At a WAMU listening session with members of the Dar Alnoor Islamic Center in Manassas, they voiced their frustration and uncertainty about the election. By providing a space for open conversation, WAMU amplified their perspectives, shedding light on the political dilemmas they faced and ensuring their voices were part of the broader electoral discourse. "I will vote. But it is very hard to vote," said Safiya Samman, a Palestinian-American.

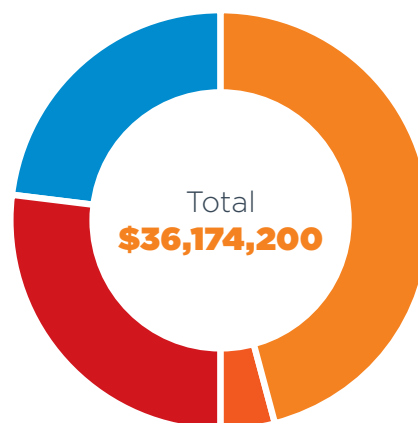

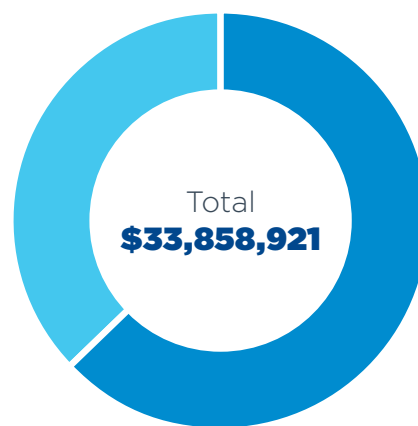
